2008 Dollars

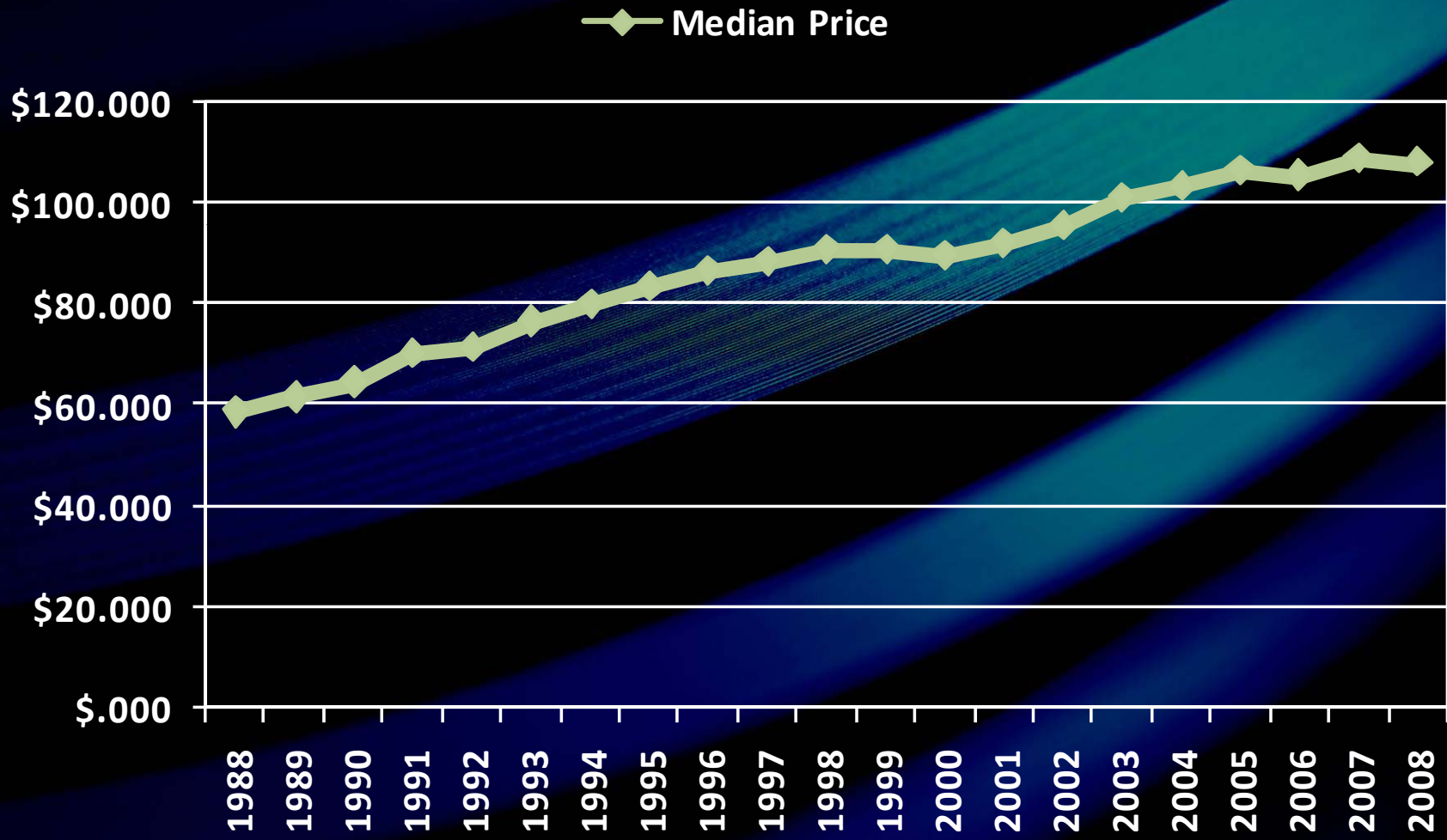

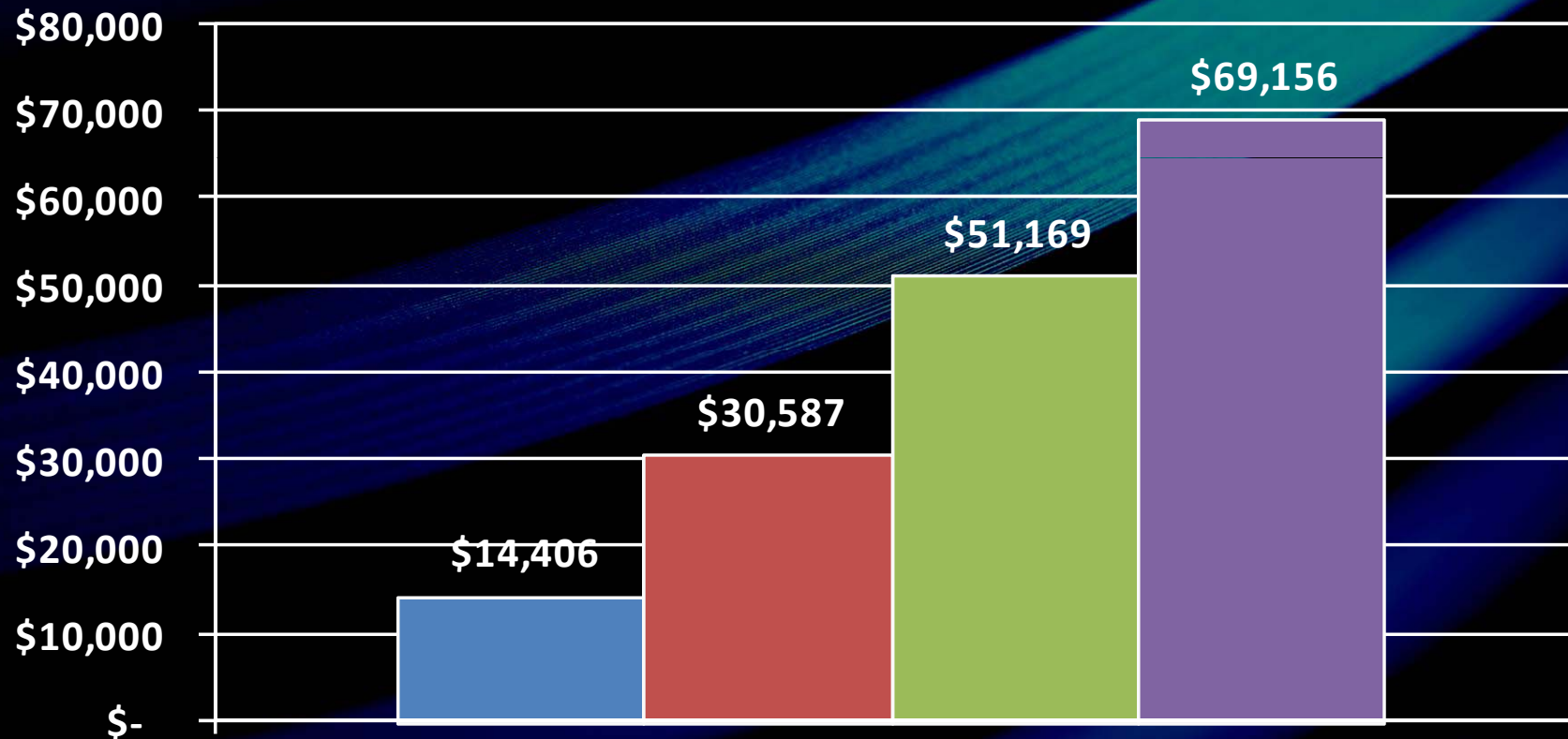
Springfield, IL Home Price Trend
